Call for Artists

The Coast Collective Gallery is calling artists to submit works to celebrate the arrival of the flowers of Spring. This show will be accompanied by a display by the Victoria Flower Arrangers' Guild April 2 - 5, and possibly other related displays.

This Fine Art Show will be juried by way of digital images. All accepted artwork will contain some version of a flower in bloom - real, fanciful or abstract; in a garden, a vase, a child's hair; in the floral print of a dress or tablecloth, painted on a pot, or printed on a book cover - any form or version. Any medium of 2- or 3-dimensional work smaller than 40 inches in any dimension will be considered. Each Artist is limited to 3 entries. No work needs to be delivered to the Gallery prior to acceptance and no adjudication fees apply.

Digital images may be submitted by e-mail to deborahcz@shaw.ca, or if images your work are already displayed on a website, that website address may be submitted with clear indication of which works on the site are to be considered in the jurying process. An application form is attached, or will soon be available on our website: www.coastcollective.ca.

Application forms, images, and/or information about where to find them on a website must be received no later than March 1, 2009. Artists will be notified by March 8 about what works have been accepted. Further instructions about the delivery of accepted works will be provided at that time.
